Dear Parents/ Carers

We are pleased to inform you that a trip to Cannon Hall for a Victorian Day is to take place on Monday 19th June 2023 for the children in Year 1 to enhance their learning in history.

We ask for a contribution of £21.00 towards the cost of the trip. It is important to stress that in the event of an inadequate number of parental contributions it will not be possible for the trip to take place and it will be cancelled.

The trip money must be paid in full by Friday 26th May 2023 along with any other outstanding money owed to school (i.e. breakfast club). If any outstanding monies are owed the Executive Principal reserves the right to refuse your child's attendance on this trip.

We would like the children to be in school for the usual time of 8.45am for registration and then we will leave school promptly at 9.15am. We will be leaving Cannon Hall for the return journey at 2.30pm and are expecting to be back around the usual home time of 3.15pm. A packed lunch will be provided for all children as they are entitled to a universal free school meal. As part of the experience of your child being a Victorian child for the day, we would also like them to come dressed as a Victorian.

Contributions to the trip should be paid via Parentpay to secure your child's place. For parents who have yet to set up an account, an activation letter will be sent home today with your child. This will also include a bar code which can be used at McColl's in Havercroft or any other Paypoint store as an alternative method of payment.

Consent

By paying for your child's trip

- You are giving consent for your child to attend the trip.
- You acknowledge that your contribution is non-refundable, unless due to exceptional circumstances.
- The times when your child is due to arrive and to be collected from the academy.

Dressing up as a Victorian. If your child would like to take part - **Girls** wore dresses and pinafores to school, with an apron over the top to protect their dresses from stains, while **boys** wore trousers and a shirt, and sometimes a waistcoat. This is optional, children can wear their school uniform if they prefer.
